RSA Conference 2016

On Tuesday March 1st Empire IT students went to the RSA Security conference at the Moscone Center in San Francisco . The RSA Conference is the biggest IT security conference in the world showcasing the newest products and security

> measures from industry leaders such as Microsoft, Cisco, RSA, IBM and many more.

> The RSA Conference has gotten bigger over the years, outlining the growing need of security in modern day computing. Keynote speakers included various CEOs of major IT companies as well as Admiral Michael S. Rogers, the head of the NSA and US cyber command, Actor/Director Sean Penn, and US Attorney General Loretta Lynch.

> Hundreds of vendors were pushing endpoint security products and cloud based security. Movement of data, user behavior, malware and potential attacks are all monitored, and can be managed in the Cloud by

a vendor. Big were products featuring Multi-Factor Authentication (logging on to a system with more than just a password) and such devices as access tokens, smart cards, biometric devices and even cell phone for network authentication were also featured. It would be easy to spend the entire week of the conference in the expo hall and not visit all of the available booths.

The students from Empire got to play games, collect swag, win prizes and attend presentations while

learning about the myriad of offerings provided by the vendors. All in all, a great experience for everyone who went!

This has led to a recycling and donation program that has provided tech students with machines that can be used to build a network at home.




