CLASS DESCRIPTION:	This class is presented to orient the student to Commercial and Government insurance programs. These include Medi-Cal (Medicaid), Healthy Families, Medicare, State Disability, Worker's Compensation, TRICARE, CHAMPVA, Managed Care Plans such as HMO's and PPO's. Medical ethics and legal issues pertaining to patient billing are discussed.	
CLASS OBJECTIVES:	<ol style="list-style-type: none">To introduce the student to Federal (Medicare) and State (Medi-Cal) guidelines.To provide the student with a description of the various insurance plans and systems of delivering health care.To introduce the student to legal/ethical issues that affect insurance claims and medical records.To introduce the student to managed care including when and how to request authorization for services and procedures.To introduce the student to common acronyms used in the insurance community.	
CLASS FORMAT OVERVIEW:	The class is conducted in the lecture, question and answer discussion method with each student having the opportunity to participate. Correction of projects in class is an integral part of the learning experience. There will be speakers on various methods of delivering health care throughout the course.	
METHODS OF INSTRUCTION:	As lecture and student participation are used as the principal means of instruction, it will be expected that all students will be present every day to take part in class.	

CLASS ATTENDANCE:

It is expected that each student will be in class when class begins. Should the student come in later than five minutes after class begins, he or she should be certain that the instructor has noted his or her presence in class. It will then be up to the instructor to decide if the student had arrived in time to be counted as present--the instructor's decision will be final.

REQUIREMENTS

The student must complete the workbook pages (pass/fail). Tests must be passes with a grade of 60% or better in order to pass the course.

TESTING:

Tests are given after each chapter as well as periodic quizzes to review learned work. A final is given at the end of the course using information learned during the module.

LATE TESTING:

A 10 PERCENT PENALTY WILL BE ISSUED FOR ALL LATE TESTS. If you are not present the day of the test and have not made arrangements with the instructor to take the test early, you will automatically be given the 10 percent penalty. (Late tests start with a "B").

Upon completing this course, the student will be able to:

1. Understand billing and eligibility guidelines for PPO and HMO insurance plans.
2. Explain the Medi-Cal and Medicare guidelines which pertain to patient eligibility, filing of claims, and the medical office's responsibility as a participating or non-participating provider, or when accepting assignment or not accepting assignment.
3. Participate in a class discussion regarding the guidelines and responsibility for filing claims as they pertain to Worker's Compensation, State Disability, TRICARE, CHAMPVA, and forms involved in those claims.
4. Complete various HMO authorization forms and know when to do so.
5. Complete a final exam for various insurance plans and eligibility requirements.
