- Adv. Legal Research is limited to 14 students with priority given to 3rd- and 4th-year students.
- Law Study & Exams - continuing session restarts 5/3/18 and ends 5/31/18
- Moot Court limited to 16 students, priority given to 3rd- and 4th-year students.
- Disability Law Clinic is limited to 6 students. (Option to take for 1 or 2 units also.)
- SHAC is limited to 8 students. (First three training class sessions meet 6:00 – 9:00 P.M.)
- Advanced Legal Writing is limited to 20 students.
- Elder Law and Small Claims Advisory Clinics are limited to 8 students.
