ISSUE LIST – RAIN

JON v. ALI

Trespass to Chattels – interference with umbrella, OR
Conversion—did Ali intend to return it? Did she deprive Jon of umbrella during the time he needed to use it?

MEAN LADY v. ALI & BEV

Trespass to Land—if she hates students, she probably doesn't give permission for them to take short cuts through her yard on their way home from school

ALI v. JON

Battery—he intended to splash her with water via his car tires—an unwanted touching

BEV v. JON

Battery—through transferred intent—he intended to hit Ali with water, hit Bev too
Damages—Jon is possibly liable for Bev being hit by van and for paramedics' malpractice (wrong turn)

KIM v. JON

Negligence—Jon not driving carefully enough after his battery on sisters
Damages—if jury finds wetness led to pneumonia, he's liable for medical costs, etc.

BEV v. VAL

Negligence—Val in a hurry, backing out too fast? Not looking carefully enough?
Other issues—maybe contributory negligence on Bev's part. If she's blinded, maybe she should stay close to sister. Maybe since Bev was reacting to battery, it might affect chain of causation.

ALI v. VAL

Negligent Infliction of Emotional Distress—Ali in zone of danger, witnessed accident of sister

BEV v. PARAMEDICS

Negligence—Should have GPS or better maps or eyes since every second counts in accidents
